EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

I was traveling recently and watched as a wife led her blind husband onto the plane by her arm. She lovingly helped him into his seat and made sure he was comfortable. She placed their bags above in the bin and then sat next to him. They were ready for the flight. As I sat in my seat just a few rows away, I wondered what he would do if she ever left his side.

Sometimes those we love in our life can be blind, and we need to be their eyes. They aren't physically blind, but they are unable to see the truth about their life, situation, or needs. We need to lend them our sight and insight, or they will remain in their world of darkness.

Jesus asked his disciples, "Can a blind person guide a blind person?" If we aren't actively working to be sure that we can see clearly, what will we be able to offer someone we care about when they come to us with their blindness? Can you lead someone to Christ if you aren't living a life with him yourself? Can you share with another truth if you aren't concerned with knowing the truth yourself?

Life is not always easy. Without faith, hope, and love, the road can be too hard to travel. **We are not created to be alone.** Instead, we are created to be traveling companions. However, the blind cannot lead the blind. May the Light of Christ dispel your darkness and give you sight so that when the call comes, you might lend an arm to lead the blind. -Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

Cuando me senté en mi asiento a solo unas pocas filas de distancia, me pregunté qué haría él si ella alguna vez dejara su lado.

A veces los que amamos en nuestra vida pueden ser ciegos, y necesitamos ser sus ojos. No son físicamente ciegos, pero no pueden ver la verdad sobre su vida, situación o necesidades. Necesitamos prestarles nuestra visión y perspectiva, o permanecerán en su mundo de tinieblas.

A MESSAGE FROM DARLEINE ARCE, OUR CATECHETICAL COORDINATOR



Next weekend, not only do we change our clocks due to Daylight Saving Time, but also the liturgical year changes from Ordinary Time to Lent! Many will probably *moan* and *groan* because, for most, it may mean “time to give up [fill favorite food/ thing]” AND we give up meat on Fridays. As a catechist, first, and coordinator, second, I love asking children what they are doing for Lent and love to hear their responses. Even though they are not required to make the same sacrifices as adults (observances of fasting), it is helpful to teach them the value and discipline of sacrifice – especially in consideration of what that sacrifice is supposed to accomplish in us – drawing us back to God and turning from sin. My own nieces (5 year olds) often tell me how they’re “eating clean” for Lent, which really means “no chocolate” – bear in mind that lollypops, air-heads, and all other candies that are made of SUGAR and not chocolate are not part of

that arrangement. It usually warrants a discussion on the “value” of that chocolate in comparison to the cross of Christ. *My guilt trip wins every time*. All joking aside, it really is very difficult to find a worthy sacrifice for Lent. We do not want to give up the necessities of life (food, water, showers) and we should not give up those activities we need to sustain us (work, exercise, sleep). Therefore, here are five simple ideas that I really like and have used in the past and often recommend to others:

- 1. Live Simply:** I BET you have at least one drawer (or perhaps a whole room) that is full of things that you no longer use or have a need for. Why not consider donating one item each day of Lent? Not only will this help you live more simply, but, in turn, your donations allow you to contribute to organizations that do charitable work in our community (SVdP, Clothes Less Traveled-PTC, and maybe even food banks if you buy food items in bulk.)
- 2. Be hospitable:** With the accelerated process of ‘*privatization*’ of family life, it is becoming more challenging than ever to form strong social bonds within the community. One recommendation for your family would be to reach out and invite a family or parishioner from the community over to your house for dinner. Consider doing it several times during the Lenten season.
- 3. Become spiritually unencumbered:** The busyness of life often draws our attention away from God. There always seems to be something that we need to get done before we can [*insert spiritual exercise here*]. This Lenten season, consider doing Lectio Divina as a family; tie it into bedtime rituals with the children so that it feels more natural. Here is a link to a wonderful resource for lectio divina with children (even young children): <https://www.pbgrace.com/lectio-divina-for-kids/>
- 4. Pay-it-forward:** It’s not always reasonable (or feasible) for families to give up fast-food, ...*you know who you are...* parents who spend more time in their cars commuting from school to clubs to practices to church. I appreciate you and do not want you or your children to go without food. So, what if instead of giving up fast food (often times one of your main meals in a given day) you “pay it forward” by paying for the person behind you at the drive-thru or grocery store? If it is not feasible for you to pay the full amount, consider paying *something*. Alternatively, consider calling up the local school and ask to make a donation towards the child with the highest running balance for cafeteria meals. You’d be amazed at the number of children who cannot afford the school lunches and do not have sufficient food at home.
- 5. Step out of your comfort zone:** *Reflect on what or who makes you feel uncomfortable (because it poses a challenge to your status quo)... and then delve in!* I have a good friend who chooses to evangelize by preparing bag lunches for homeless people: sandwiches, chips, and an apple. He delivers them on the weekend to places where he knows that they gather/sleep when not in shelters. Consider something similar or reach out to a local place that prepares meals for others and offer to bring a crockpot of food.

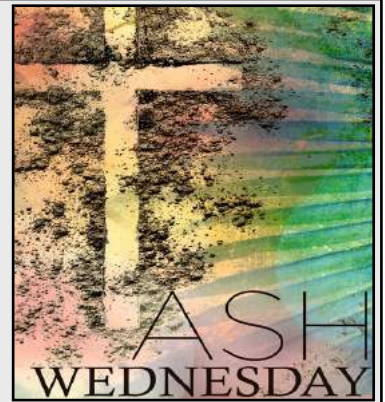
Many people approach Lent the same way that *Resolutionaries* (people who set **unrealistic* resolutions*) approach the gym on January 1. On Ash Wednesday, *Resolutionaries* make dramatic promises for fasting, penance, and almsgiving. *"A holy Lent is more likely one to be discerned and planned rather than lived either impulsively or with grim determination."* For those on the extremes, don't tackle this season as a way to "show" the Lord how good, determined, or focused you are and don't settle for mediocrity and presume God to just "deal" with the fact that you'll give up and give in halfway through. My friends, the victory is ultimately the Lord's. In humility, we can discern and plan for the sacrifices that we are being called to make, and draw strength from God to carry them through.
